251 of 254 Texas counties are mental health prescriber shortage areas (the other three counties have partial designations).*


170 counties do not have a general psychiatrist.**

BY THE NUMBERS

Allowing psychologists to prescribe could increase the number of prescribing mental health providers by roughly

30%



WHAT ABOUT PUBLIC SAFETY?

The RxP bill is based on a nationally based curriculum and requires:

- Completion of a post-doctoral master's degree in psychopharmacology
- Passing a national exam (PEP)
- 2,000 hours of supervised practice
- Informing the patient's primary care physician of prescribed medications
- Maintaining professional liability insurance
- Completion of annual continuing education in pharmacology and psychopharmacology

STATES WITH RXP AUTHORITY

Psychologists already safely prescribe in all branches of the military, the Indian Health Service, the U.S. Public Health Service Commissioned Corps, and seven states.***
